Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA ®)

FAFSA - the FREE Application for Federal Student Aid, is the application all MHS seniors who are attending a postsecondary school next year will need to complete in order to determine your eligibility for any possible aid toward the cost of attending your school. This application should **ONLY** be accessed through the official government website: www.fafsa.gov

Normally this application becomes available October 1st each year, however due to improvements to the form, this year the release is delayed. At this point the projected release is by December 31, 2023. Since this will likely take place while we are on break here are a few tips to prepare.

- 1. Create your FSD ID this is how you will "sign" your application once completed:
 - *Both the student AND a parent/guardian will need to create their own for this here: https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch
- 2. Remember this is a FREE application, don't pay anyone to complete this for you.
 - * There are some websites tat will claim to complete it for you at a cost to you, these tend to be scams!
- 3. Check the website regularly to see if it has been released, if desired. www.fafsa.gov

Online Family Access is available for all families in the district. To obtain a username and password, contact the district office at (715) 232-1642. Please, for security reasons, do NOT share your parent login with your child. Go to www.sdmaonline.com and click on the *Parent Info* link. You can access your child's attendance, grades, fees, and lunch balance. Please remember to update your information and emergency contacts on Skyward Family Access for your student(s). You can also pay online fees for the high school and sports fees.

Attendance Reminder

Good school attendance is one predicator of academic success. All Menomonie High School students are required to be in attendance from 7:40 a.m. to 3:15 p.m. unless a modified schedule has been approved by administration. Additionally, students are reminded that they have a maximum of 10 school days that can be missed during the school year for personal illness, religious services, and family activities. If a student needs to attend an appointment during school hours, a note from that business office needs to be turned into the Attendance Office when the student returns. This way the absence does not count towards those 10 days. If your child is absent please call (715) 232-2993 or email mhs_attendance@msd.k12.us.
