#### PreACT/ACT/PSAT/ASVAB

This year all high school students in grades 9-11 will participate in the State of Wisconsin administration of the ACT suite of assessments to measure college and career readiness at no cost to families.

- Grade 9 Pre- ACT Early High School (Spring 2024 -Late April/May)
- Grade 10 Pre- ACT Early High School (Spring 2024 -Late April/May)
- Grade 11 PSAT test October 19, 2023, only 40 tests available. The cost is \$20, sign up in the counseling office. It is recommended for the top 15% of the Junior class on Students qualifying for the National Merit Scholarship must take the test on this date.
- ASVAB Oct. 26th Open to Junior & Seniors considering the military. Sign up in the counseling office by Monday Oct. 23th. No cost for assessment.
- ACT March 26, 2024 <u>Special Note: All 11th Grade</u> <u>students in Wisconsin will be taking the ACT at no</u> cost to families.

Our school counseling department goals are to assist *all* students at MHS to take a variety of courses that will build personal & academic skills and interests in potential college or career areas. In addition, we hope to assist you in exploring different career pathways and college choices by using a variety of tools and delivery methods.

## "Time-line" of expected experiences at MHS:

- All students in grades 9-12 will use tools such as "Xello" to assist them in exploring their interests in career pathways. In addition, the Counseling Team has created **Google Classrooms** for **each grade level** this year to house important information, documents, slides, and links that will be resources to them this year and beyond. Students have the option to "invite" their parent or guardian to access this information as well.
- Freshmen & Juniors along with their parents are invited to attend an Academic & Career Planning Presentation for their grade level during PT Conferences on Oct. 26th, 2023. # SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL WELLNESS

- The MHS Student Services Team has a high priority on meeting students' social and emotional needs. This year, students have 3 options to use when they want to meet with their School Counselor:
- 1. Students can schedule an appointment with their School Counselor using the QR code below, based on available appointment slots each week.
- 2. If students cannot find an appointment slot available to meet their needs, they can use our "Kiosk" to request an appointment. They have access to that feature on their Chromebook, in ClassLink, or they can also use the Chromebook in the Student Services Office. Once a request is routed to the Counselor, we will schedule a time to meet with students based on their Level of Need indicated in their request.
- Students should come to directly to the counseling office if they have an *immediate need for an adult* and are
  emotionally upset. For example, if they are fearful of a physical threat towards themself or someone else, if they or
  someone else is having suicidal thoughts, or if they need support from our Resource Officer.

#### Levels of Support for Kiosk Use:

- Level I Request: Need to meet within the week for an Academic/Class concern, to receive college or career support or have questions about career exploration.
- Level II Request: Need to meet within the next day or two for a relationship concern, to help manage stress or anxiety, or help in handling a non-urgent concern with coping skills


