## ASPIRE/ACT/WORKeys/PSAT

This year all high school students in grades 9-11 will participate in the State of Wisconsin administration of the ACT suite of assessments to measure college and career readiness at no cost to families.

- Grade 9 - ACT Aspire Early High School (Spring 2017 - Late April/May)
- Grade 10 - ACT Aspire Early High School (Spring 2017 - Late April/May)
- Grade 11 - PSAT is recommended for the top 15% of the Junior class on October 11, 2017. Students qualifying for the National Merit Scholarship must take the test on this date.

ACT and ACT WorkKeys employment readiness assessment:

- ACT February 27, 2018 (makeup March 20, 2018)
- ACT WorkKeys—February 28, 2018 (makeup March 20, 2018)
- Special Note: All 11th Grade students in Wisconsin will be taking the ACT at no cost to families.

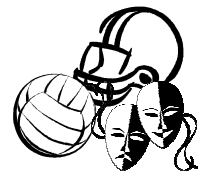
## All Activities Season Passes

## Notice of Public Health Outreach Services at Menomonie High School:

Hello! There are a variety of services that are offered at Menomonie High School to help promote student well-being and learning. Some of these services include school counseling, school psychology, school social work, and health services. Another service available to students is public health nursing adolescent outreach services. Public health nurses are available to meet with students individually or in a group setting. Public health nurses from Dunn County Health Department (DCHD) will provide prevention, education, health counseling, consultation and referrals for adolescent health issues. ### Free and Reduced Lunch

Families who may be experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to apply for the free and reduced lunch program. Guidelines change and family circumstances change as well. Applications are available in the high school office, as well as the district office. Many times our families are struggling to make "ends meet" and if they are eligible for assistance, it could really help their family. In addition, students who meet free and reduced eligibility are often times eligible for other programs. However, if an application is not submitted, they cannot receive that service. ## COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS

Our school counseling department goals are to assist *all* students at MHS to take a variety of courses that will build personal & academic skills and interests in potential college or career areas. In addition, we hope to assist you in exploring different career pathways and college choices by using a variety of tools and delivery methods.

### *“Time-line” of expected experiences at MHS:*

- **9th grade:** Students complete the ASPIRE Tests (pre-ACT) and get results that can be used to monitor college/career readiness and assist in planning for 10th grade courses. Freshmen students and families will conference with their counselors. ***If you would like text reminders for this grade level, text to the number: 81010 with the message “@383397”.***
- **10th grade:** Students complete the ASPIRE and WKCE Tests (pre-ACT) and get results that can be used to monitor college/career readiness and assist in planning for 11th grade courses. ***If you would like text reminders for this grade level, text to the number 81010 with the message “@2020mh”.***
- **11th grade:** Students and their parents meet individually with their school counselor for the Junior Educational & Career Planning Conference in the fall of junior year; Students will likely complete some form of college/military entrance test (ACT/SAT/ASVAB/PSAT) that will be used to monitor college/career readiness and assist in planning for 12th grade courses/internship options. ***If you would like text reminders for this grade level, text to the number 81010 with the message “@2019gu”.***

### ***SENIORS....are you ready?***

- Make sure you have a full 7.0 credits for the year and that you have English (1.0), Economics/Global Issues (1.0), and have made up any failed courses. If NOT - see your counselor ASAP! We are working on Transcripts/Credit Checks and will be mailing home a formal notification to all seniors in the coming weeks to verify that you are “on-track” to graduate with your class on May 27, 2017!
- If you will need some assistance with college applications, make an appointment with your counselor in the coming weeks, as WI colleges begin processing applications now! Request transcripts from the guidance office and stay tuned for a senior class meeting to review details of the application process. October is college application month.
- Make sure you get your senior portrait taken soon for the year book, the deadline is early October 16<sup>th</sup>!
- Financial Aid/Scholarship information will be posted on the school website and a “senior email” will go out to all seniors and senior parents a couple times each month with important reminders. If you did not come to a Junior Conference with your counselor/parents - provide an email address to Mrs. Ruchti to be added to that group email list. ***If you would like text reminders for this grade level, text to the number 81010 with the message “@2018m”.***
